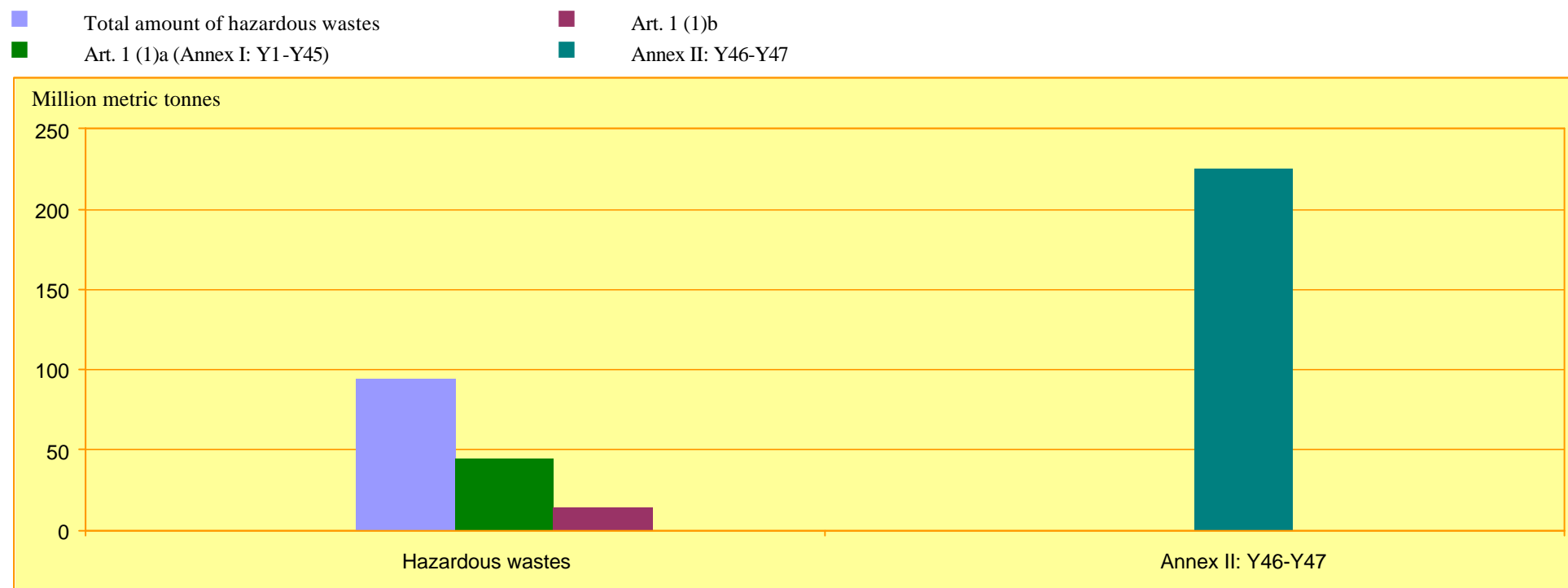


# Figure 1: Generation of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes in 2000

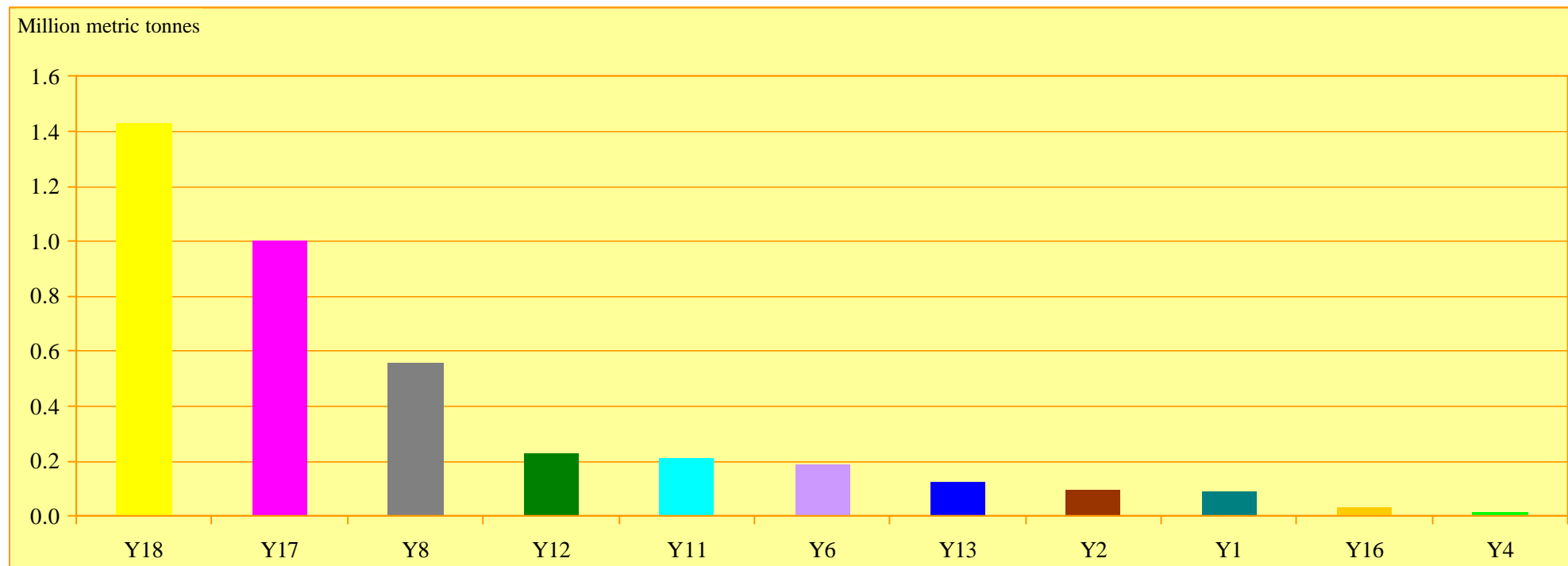

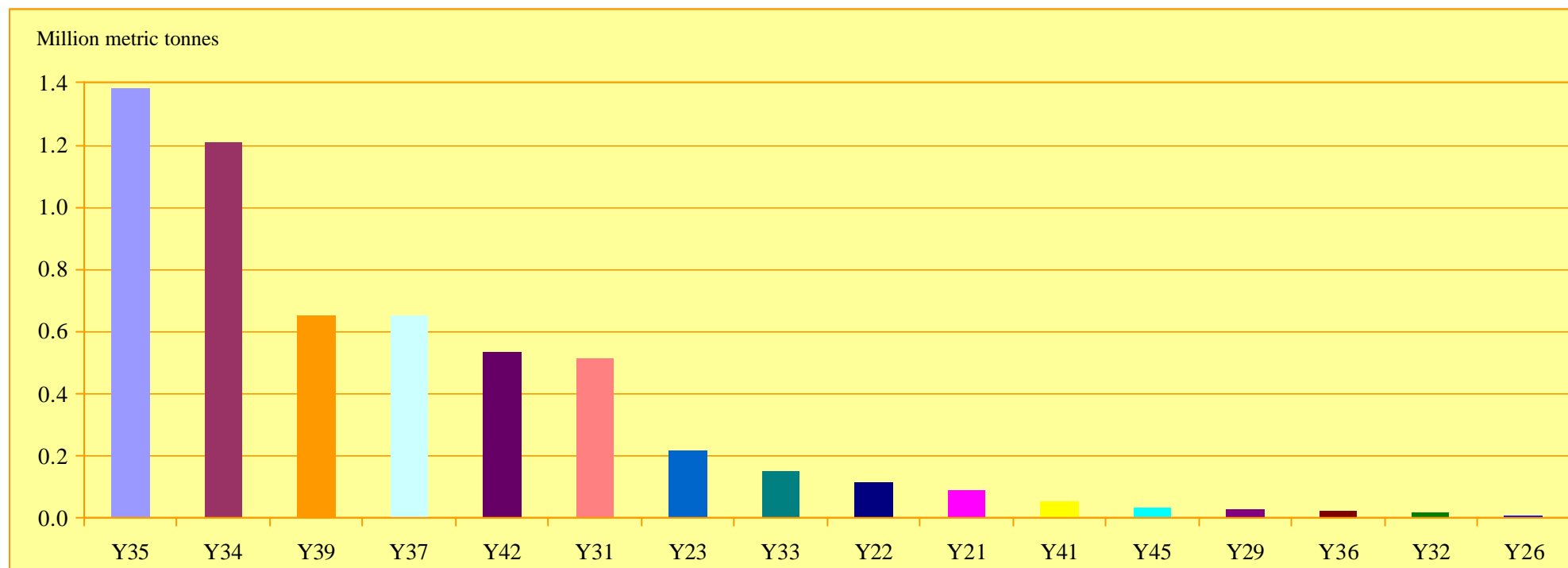

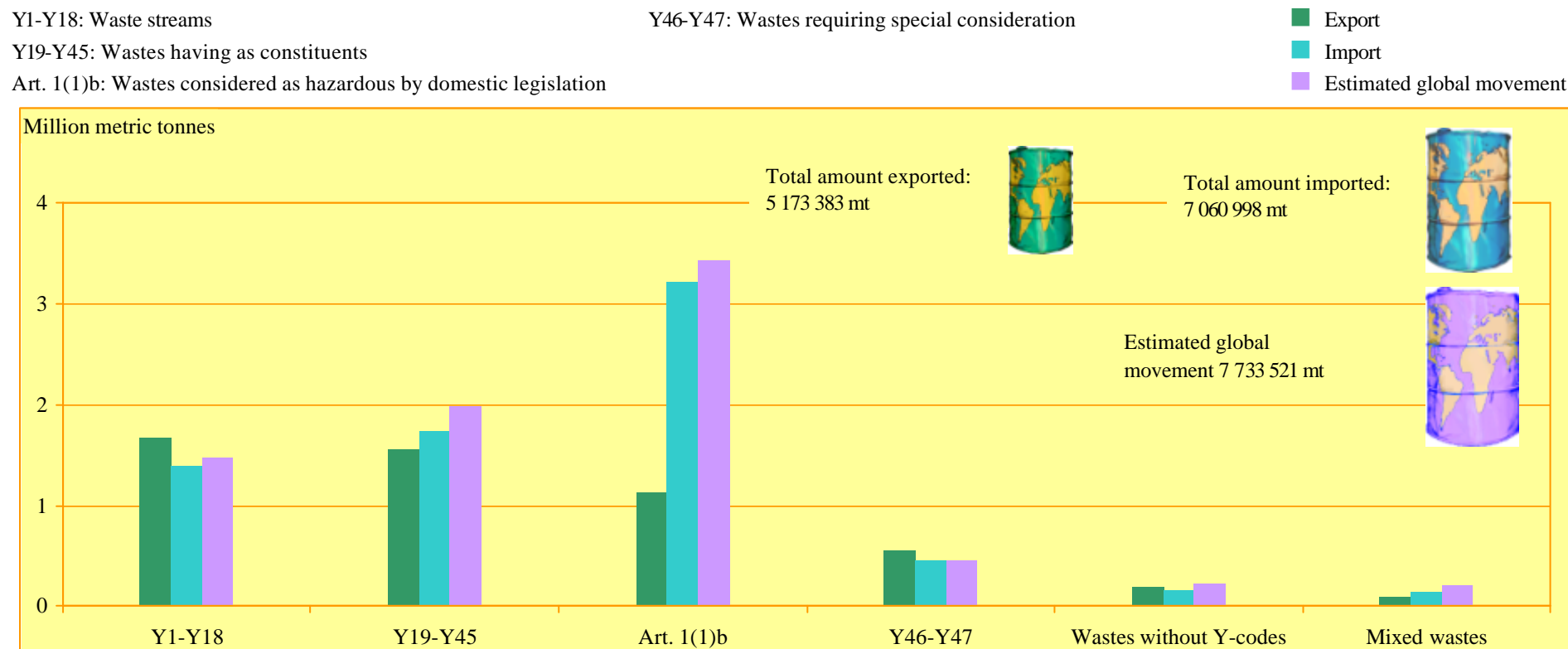

among all reporting Parties in 2000



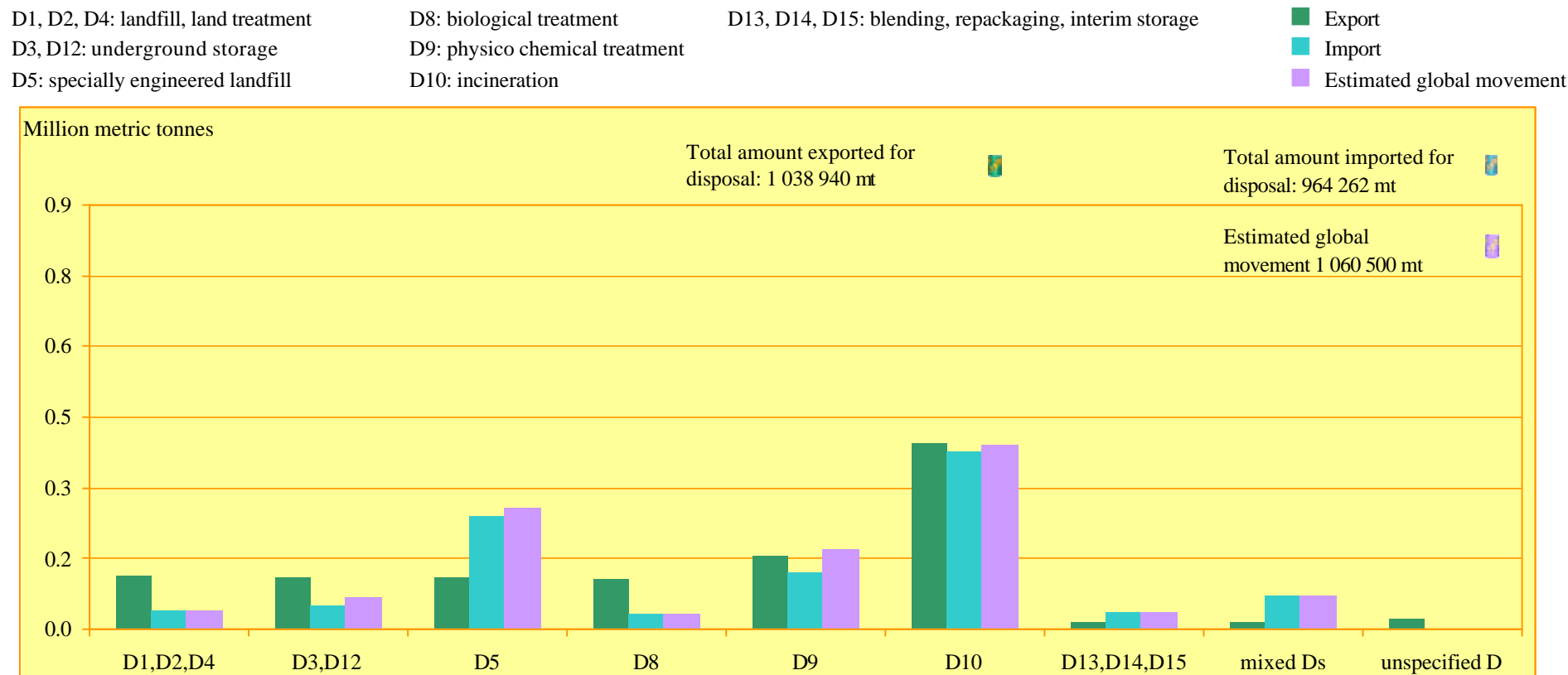

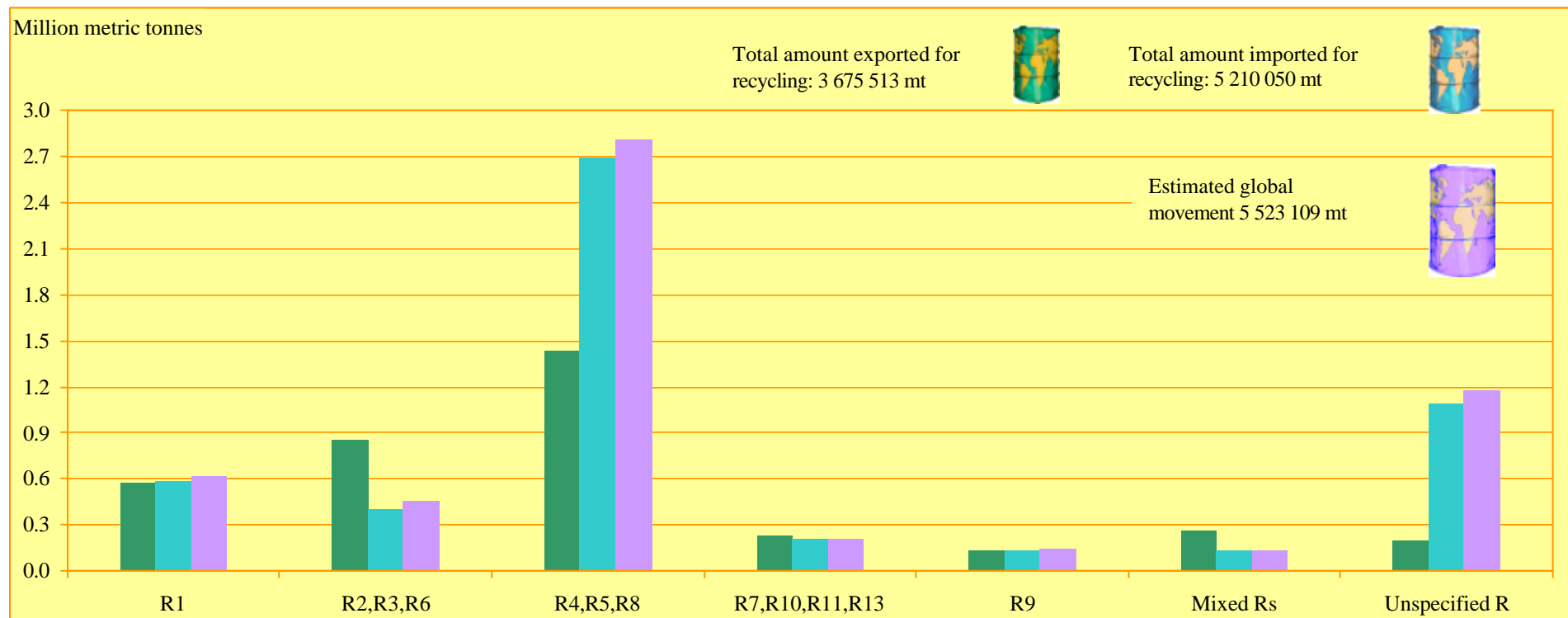

for *Recycling* among all reporting Parties in 2000

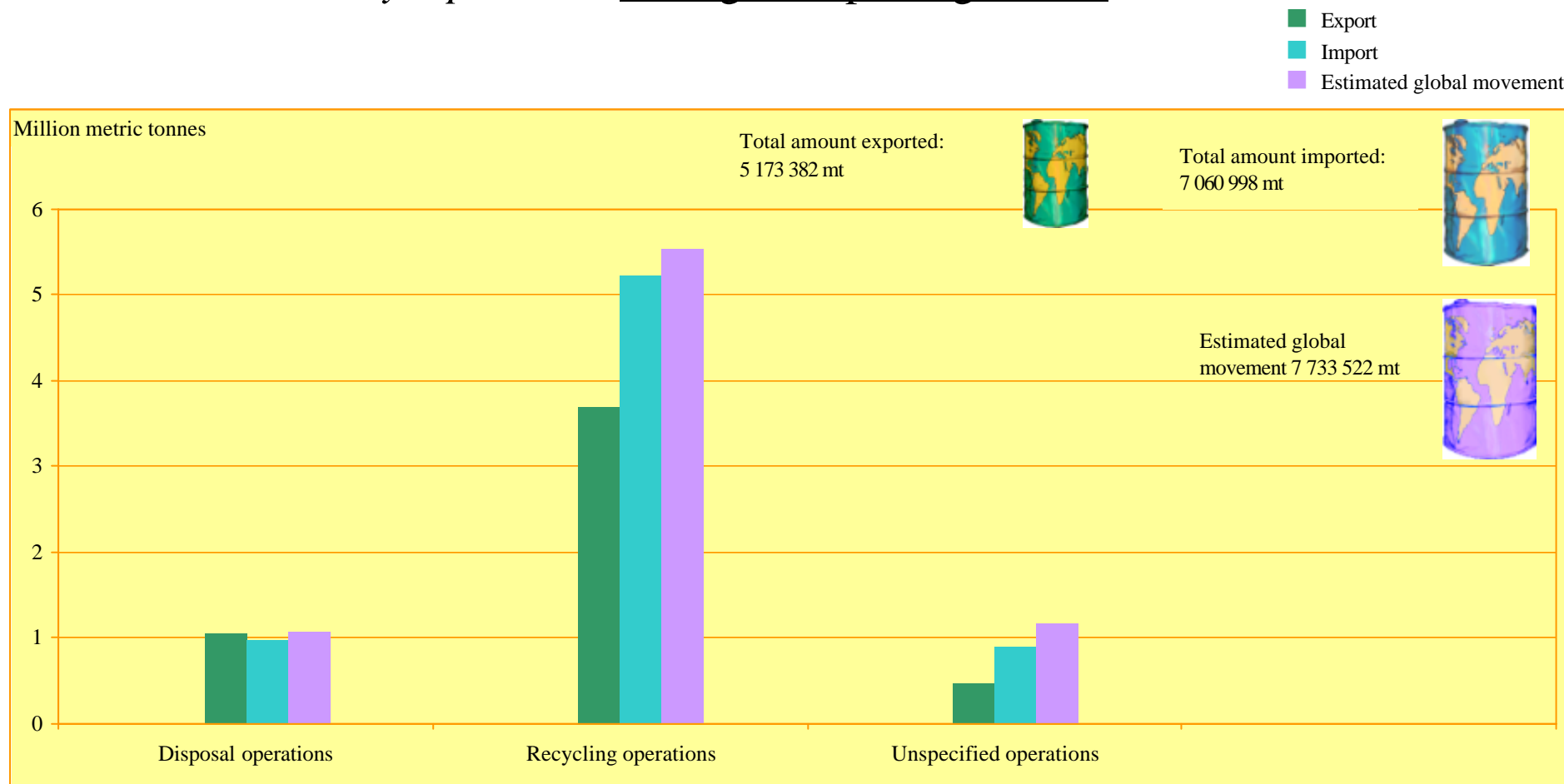

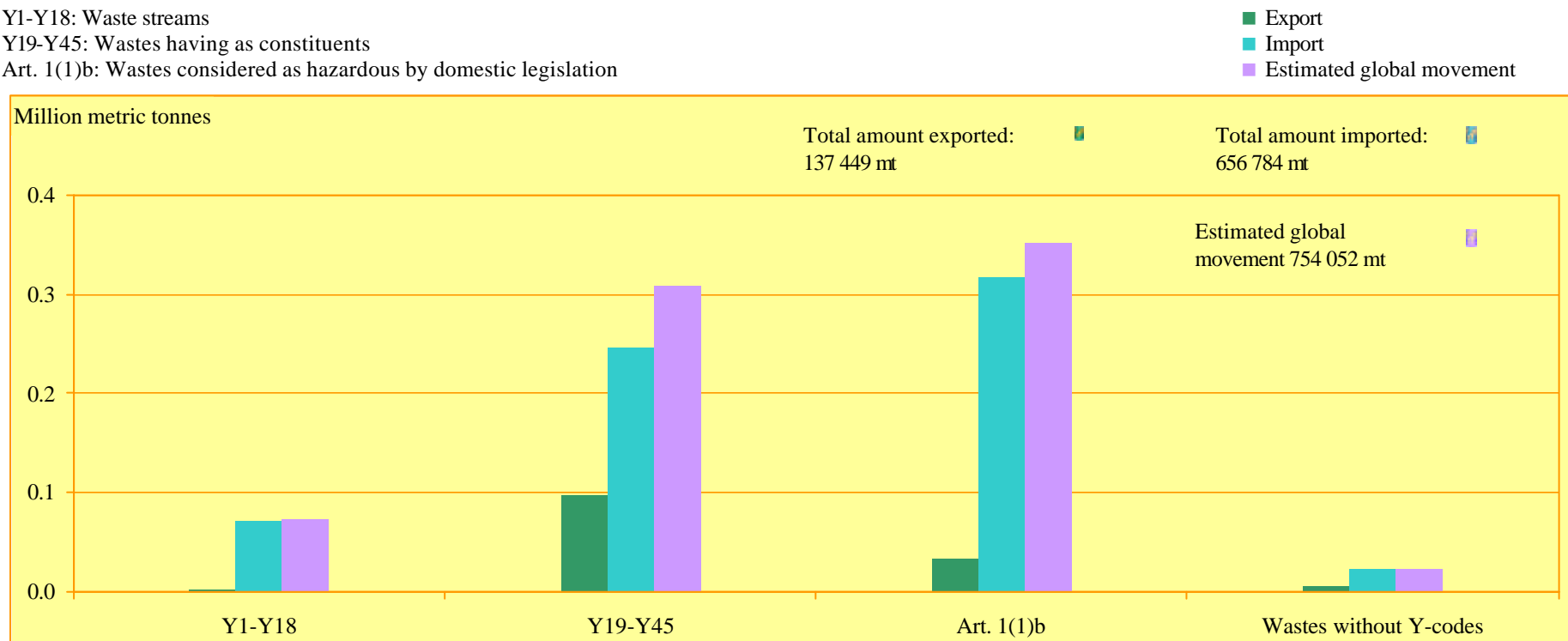

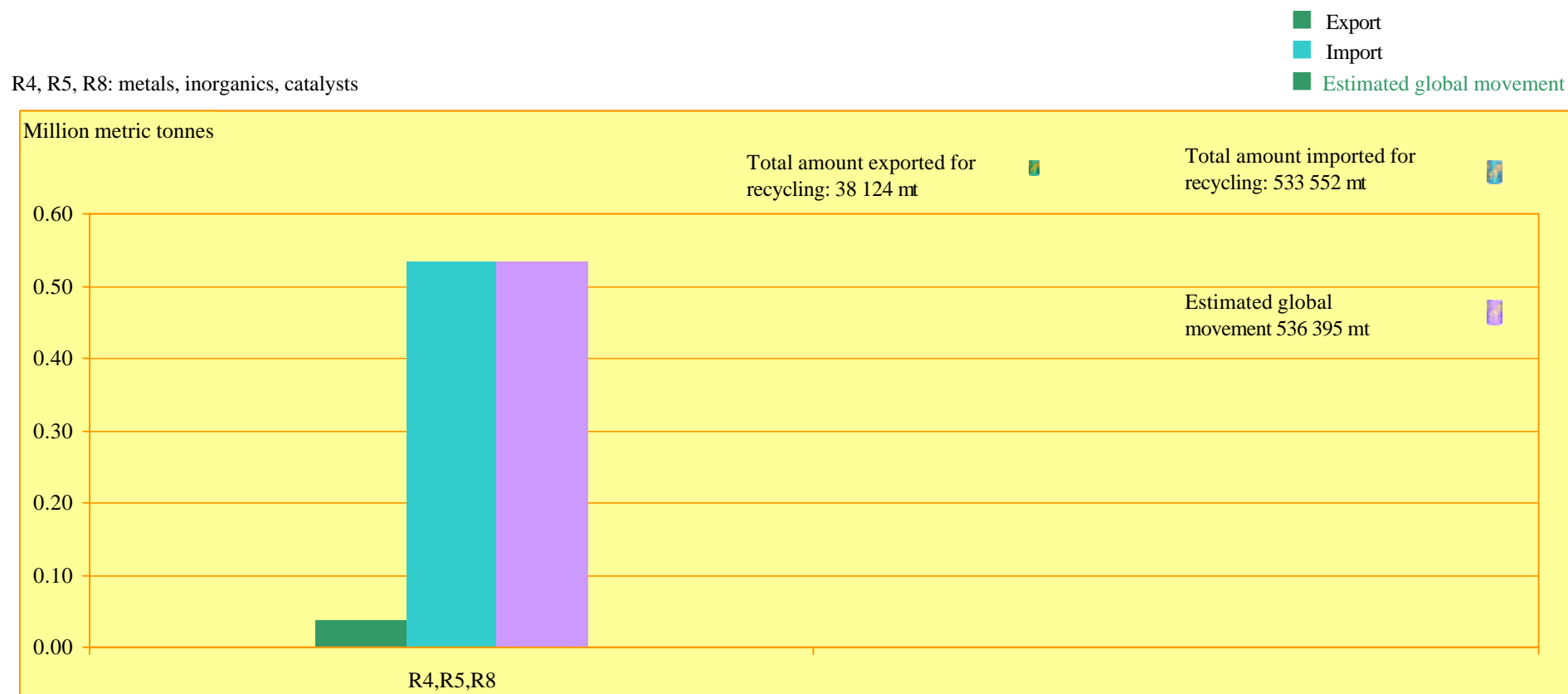

The amounts of R9 (re-refining of used oil) exported and the estimated global movement are not included because of their negligible values: 875 mt exported and 875 mt estimated global movement. There was no import of R9 (re-refining of used oil). The amounts of unspecified R operations are not included because of their negligible values: 1 mt exported, 1 315 mt imported and 1 315 mt estimated global movement.

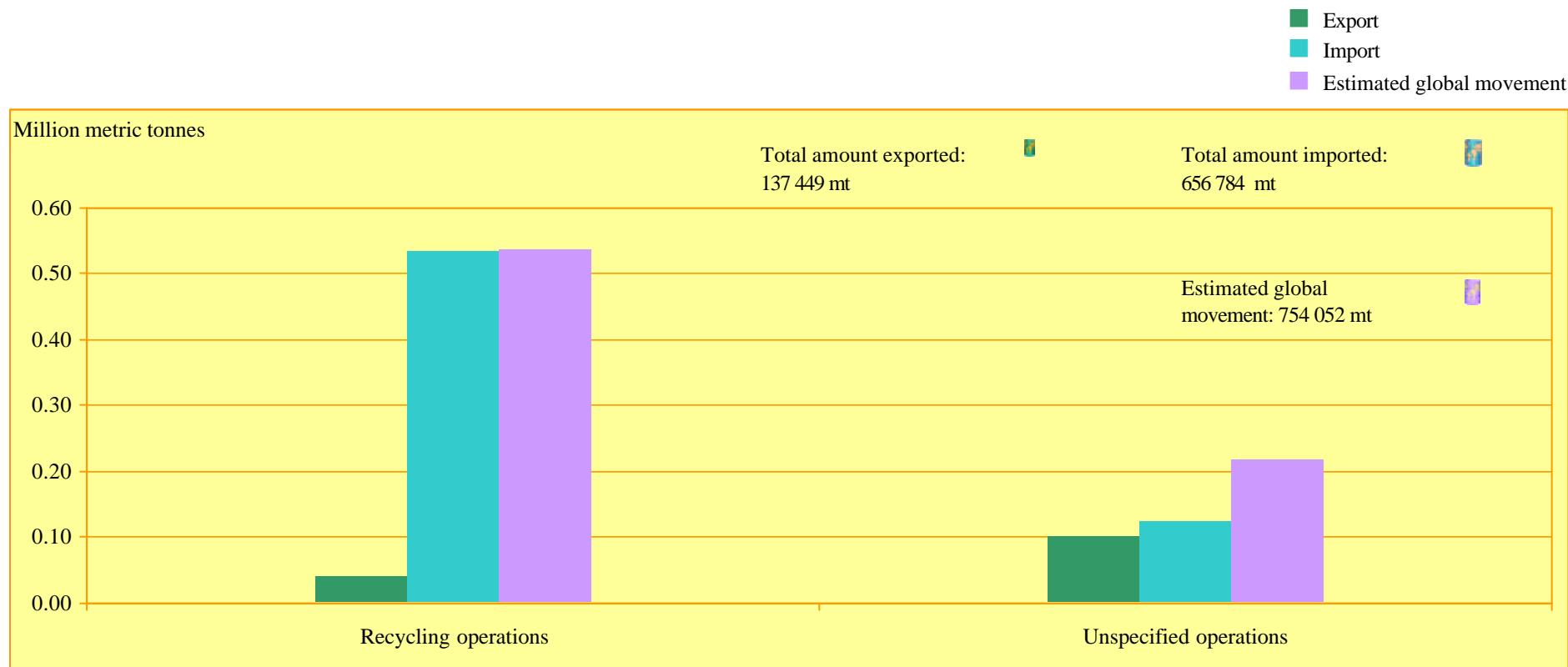

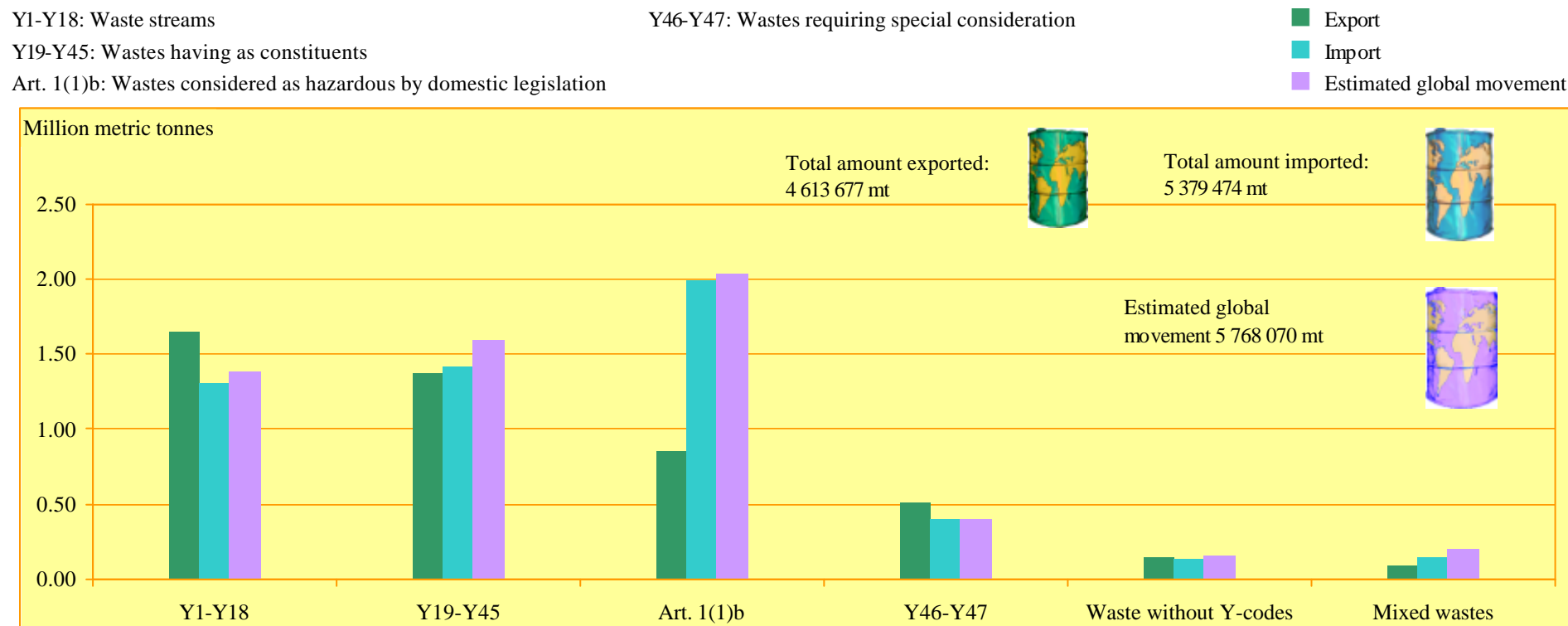

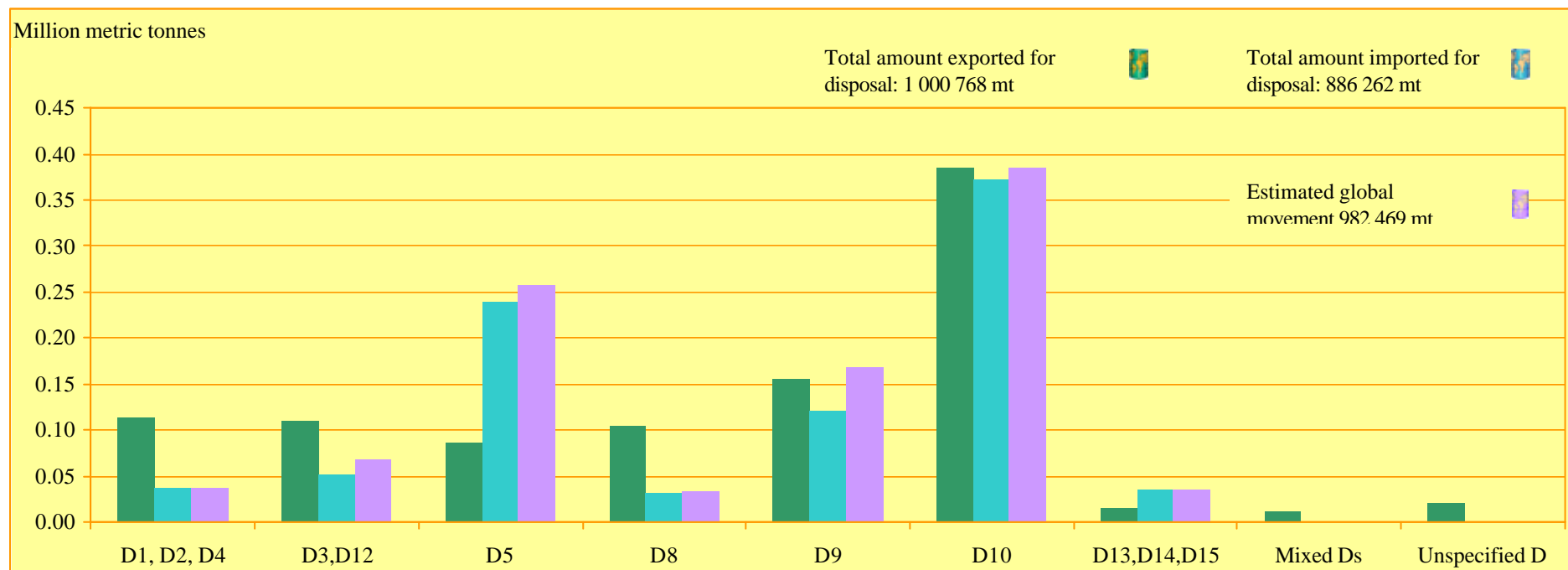
# Figure 12: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes for *Disposal* among OECD reporting Parties in 2000

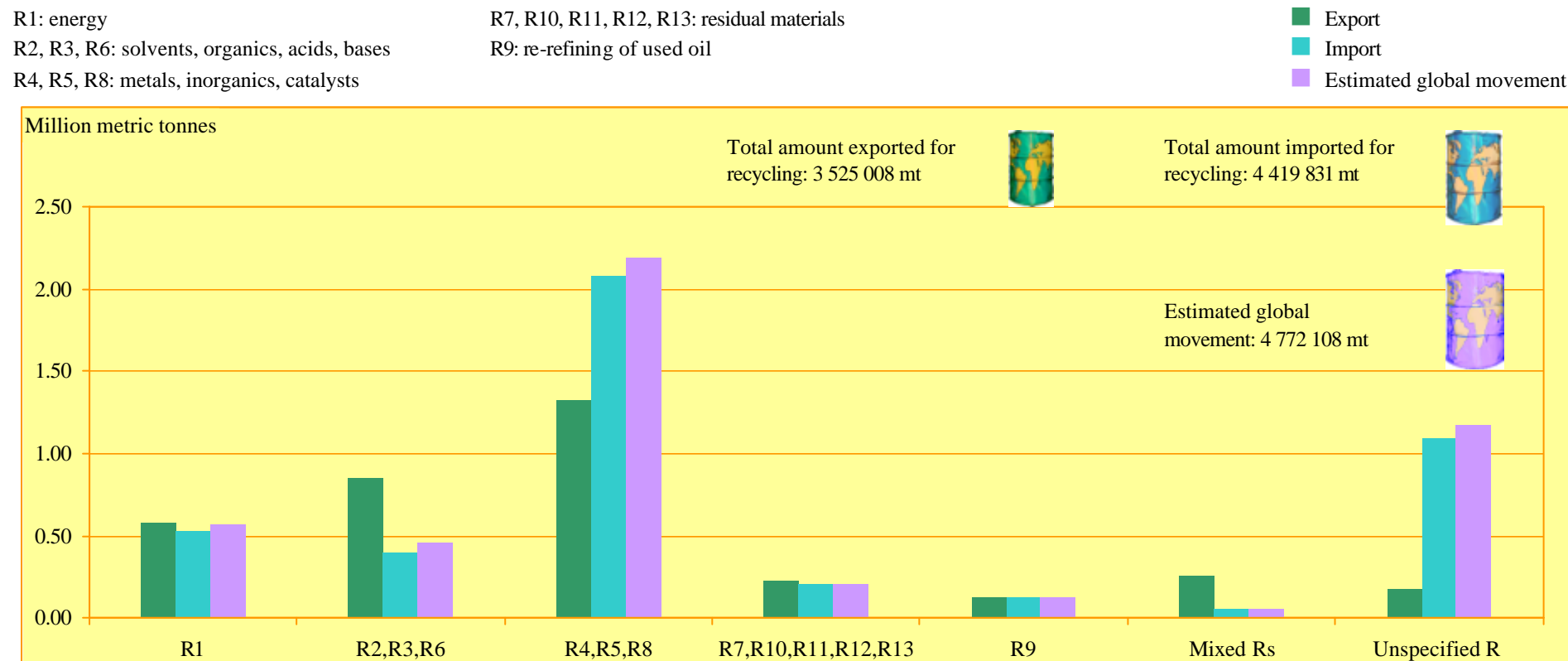

Figure 13: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes for *Recycling* among OECD reporting Parties in 2000

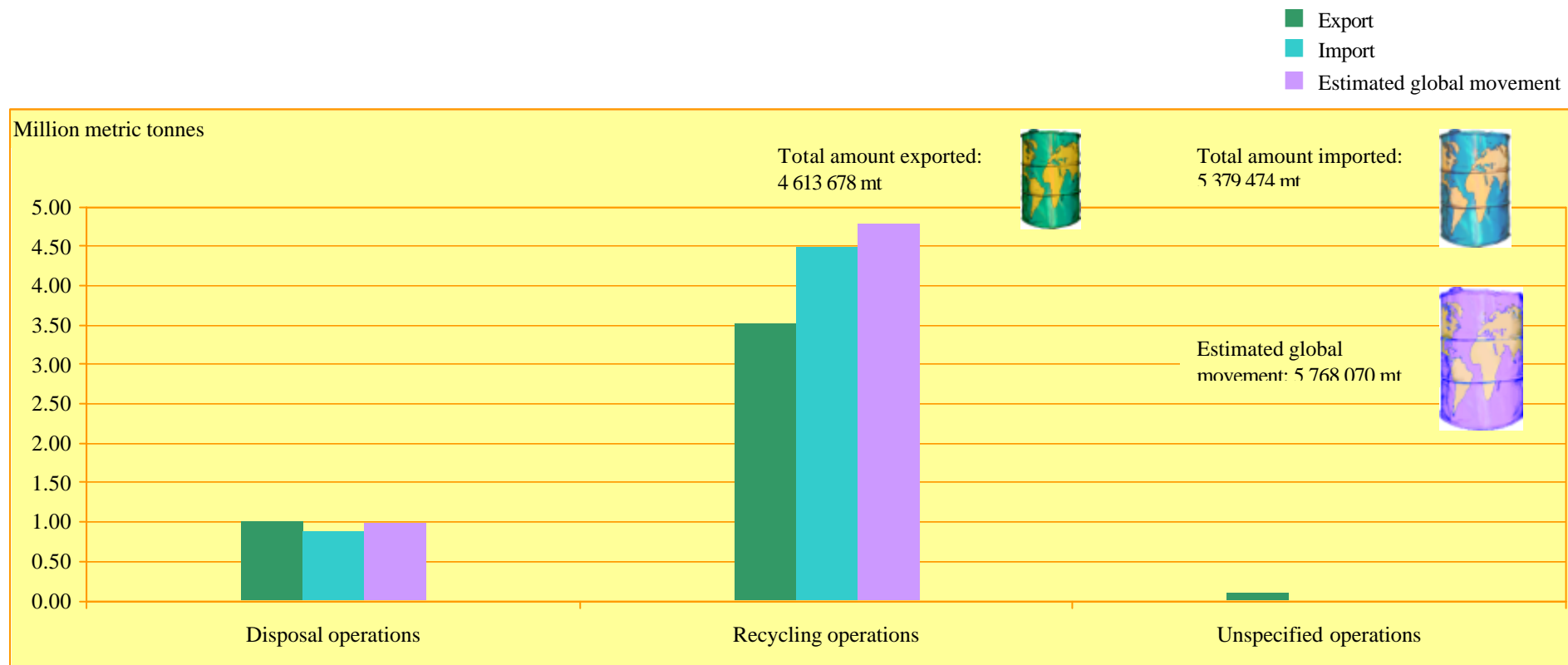

by Operation among OECD reporting Parties in 2000



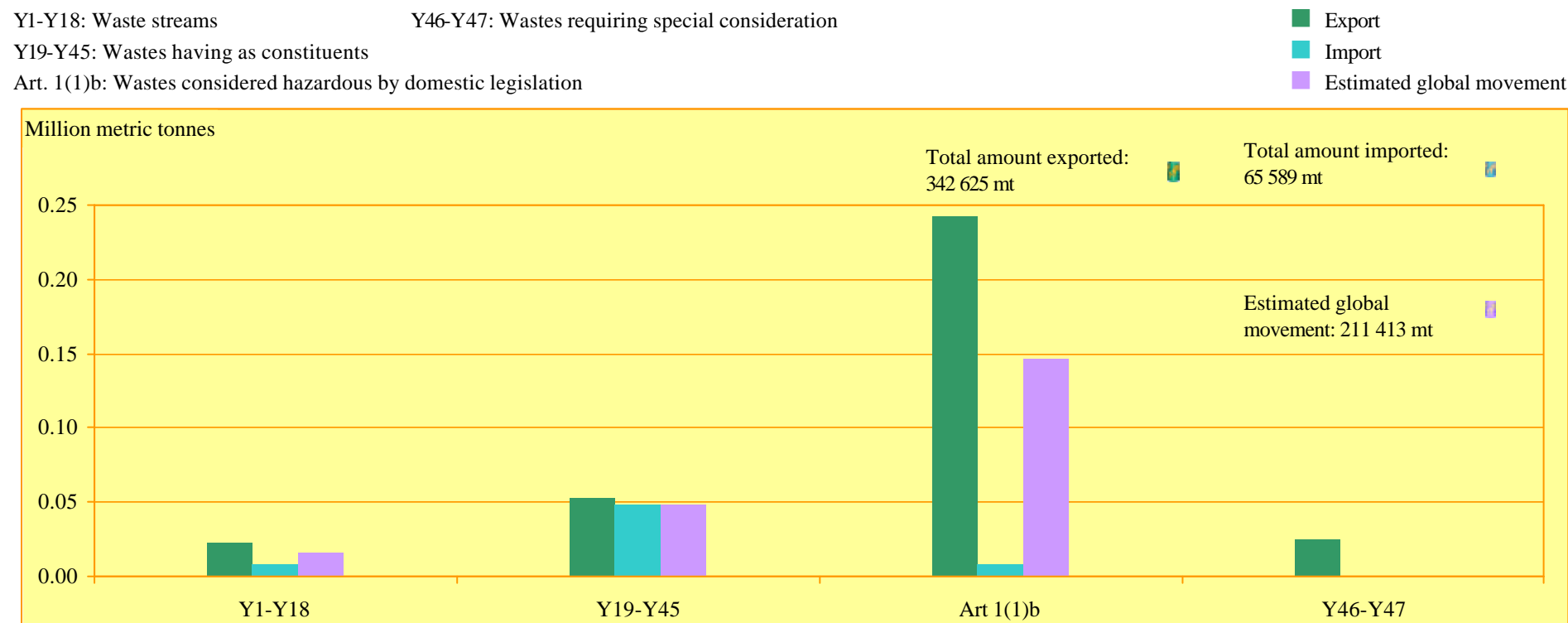

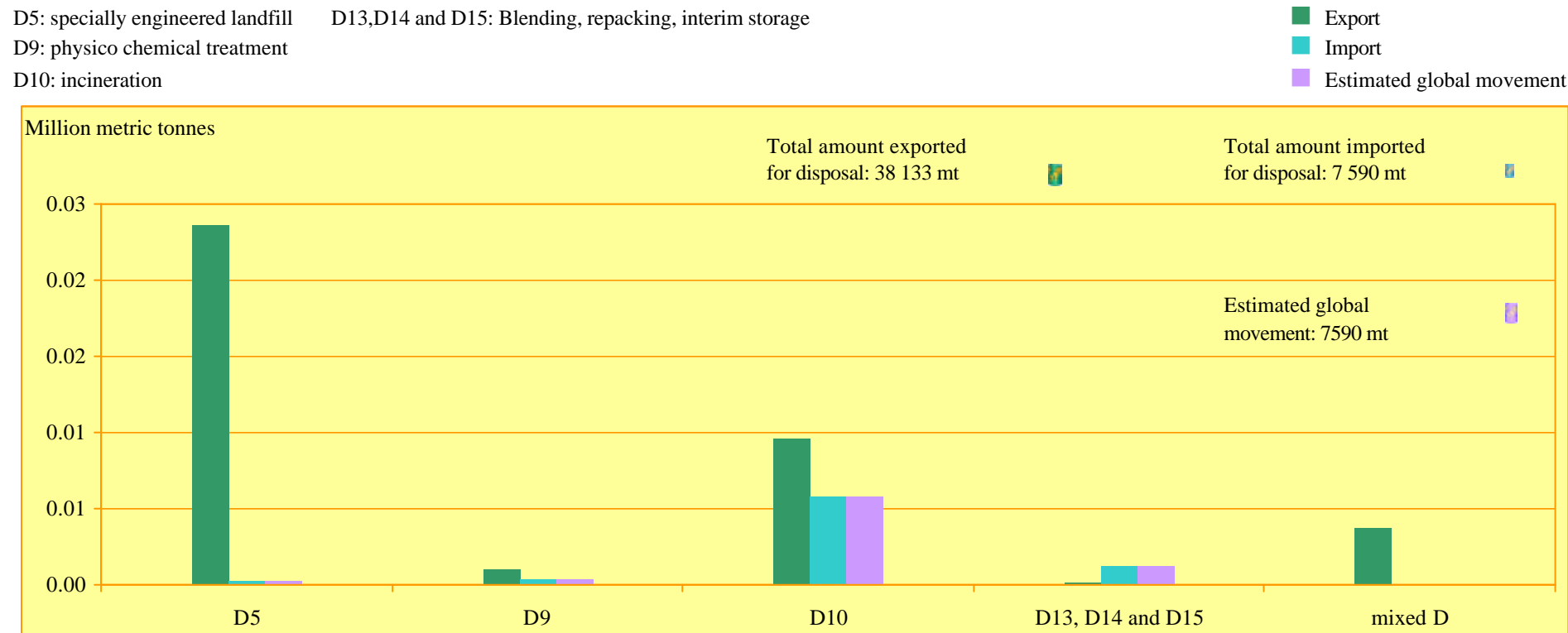

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Figure 16: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes for *Disposal* from non-OECD to OECD reporting Parties in 2000



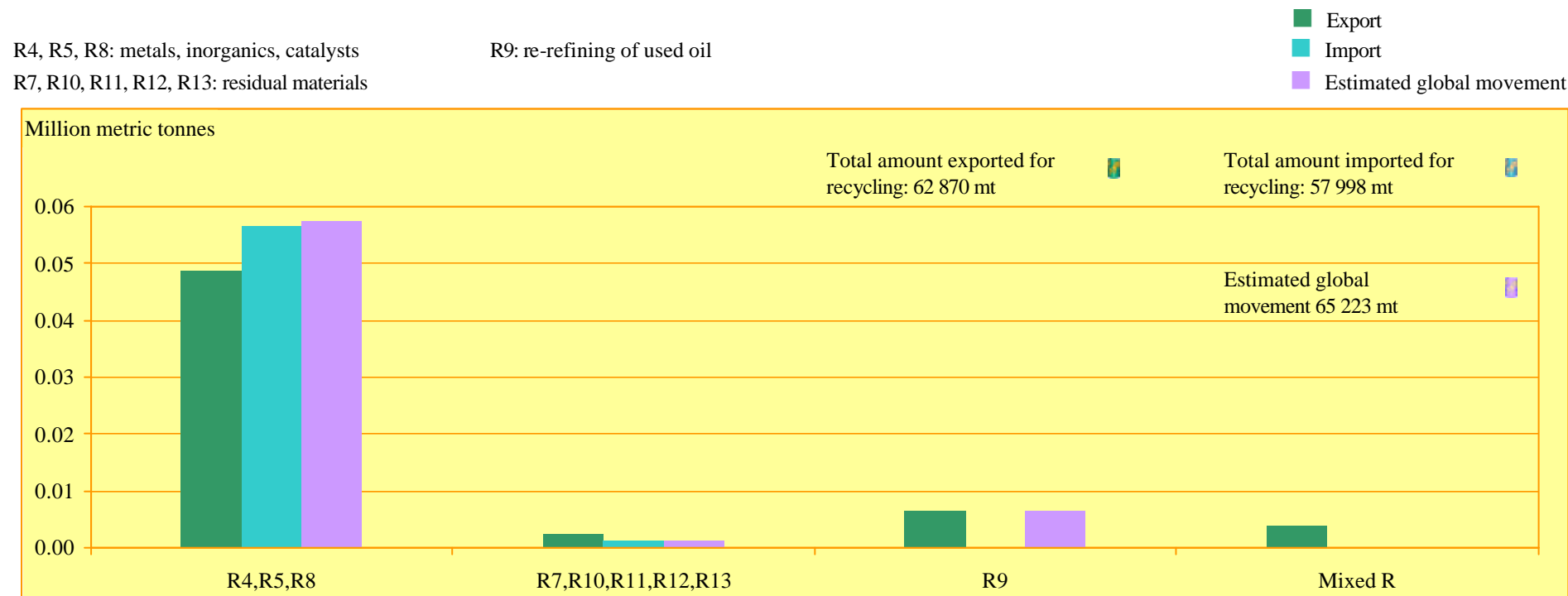

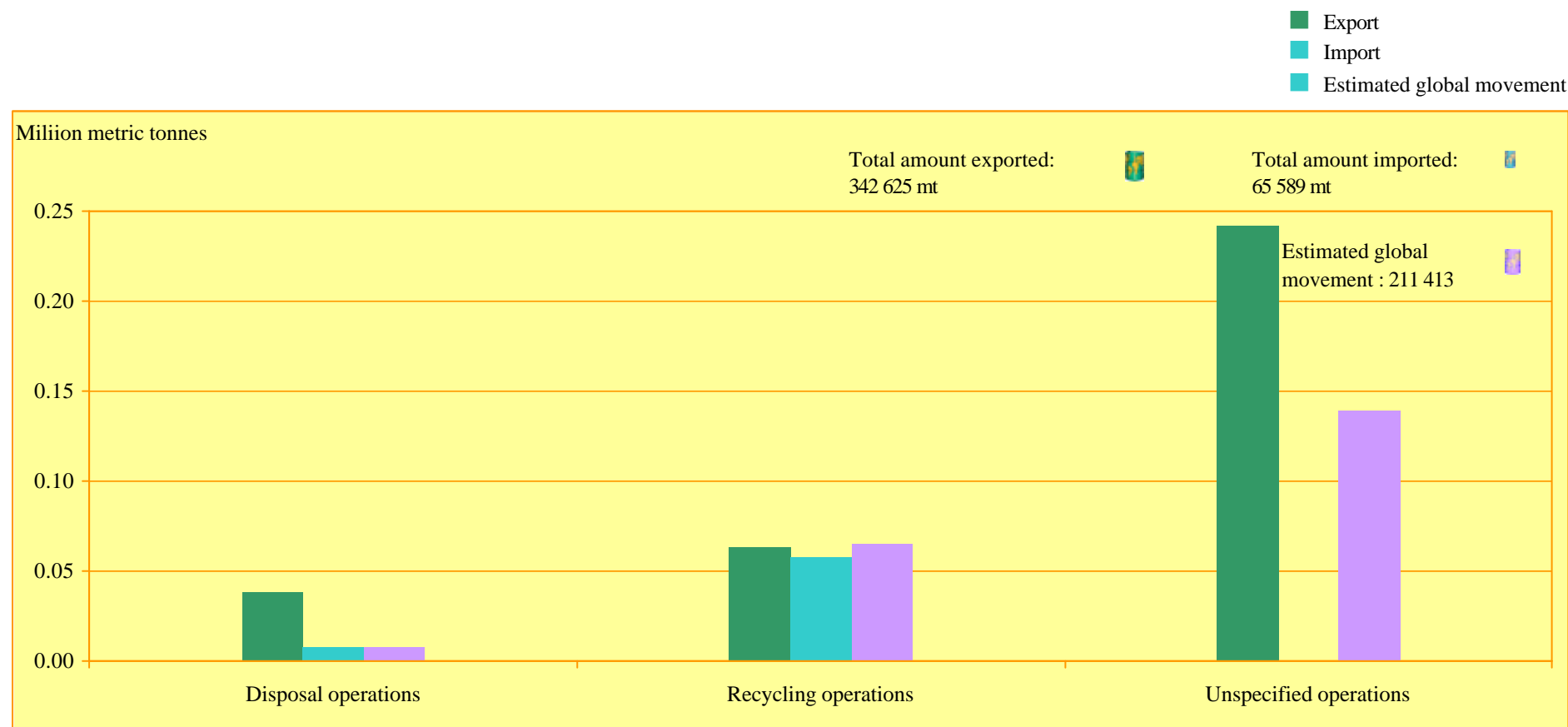

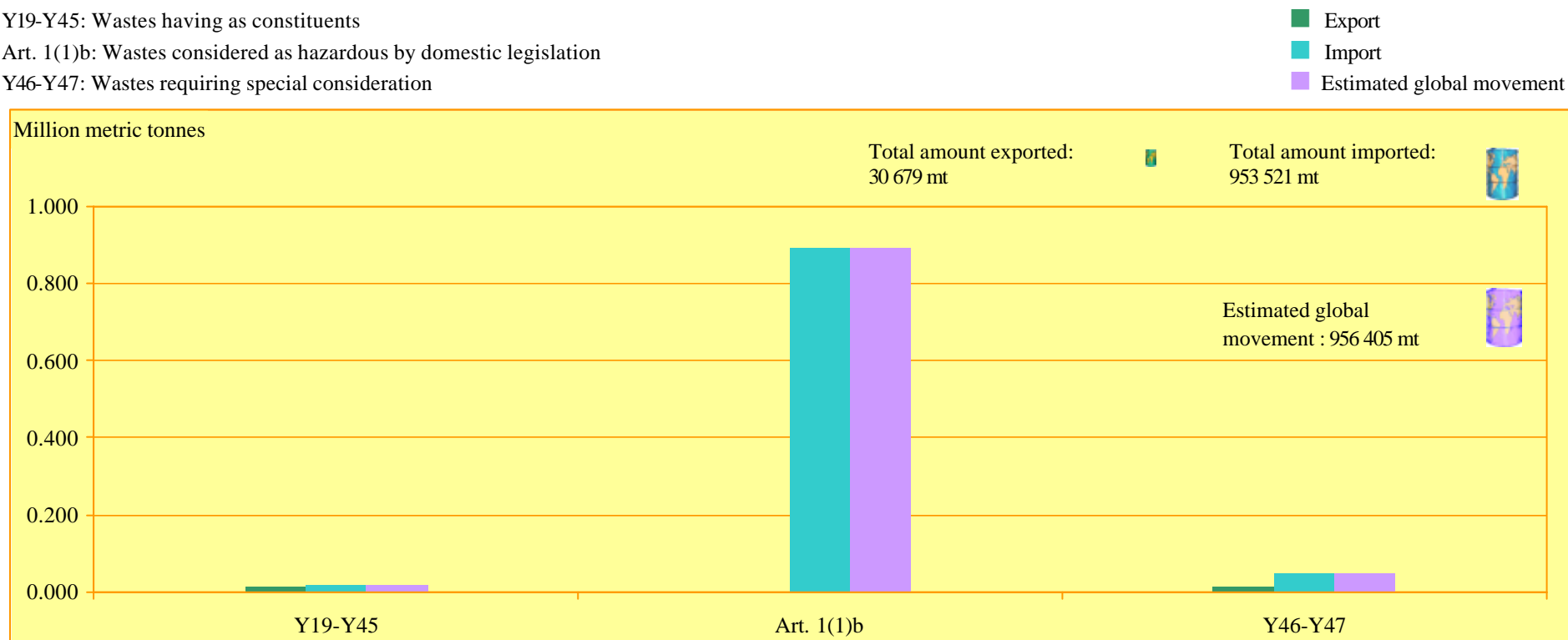

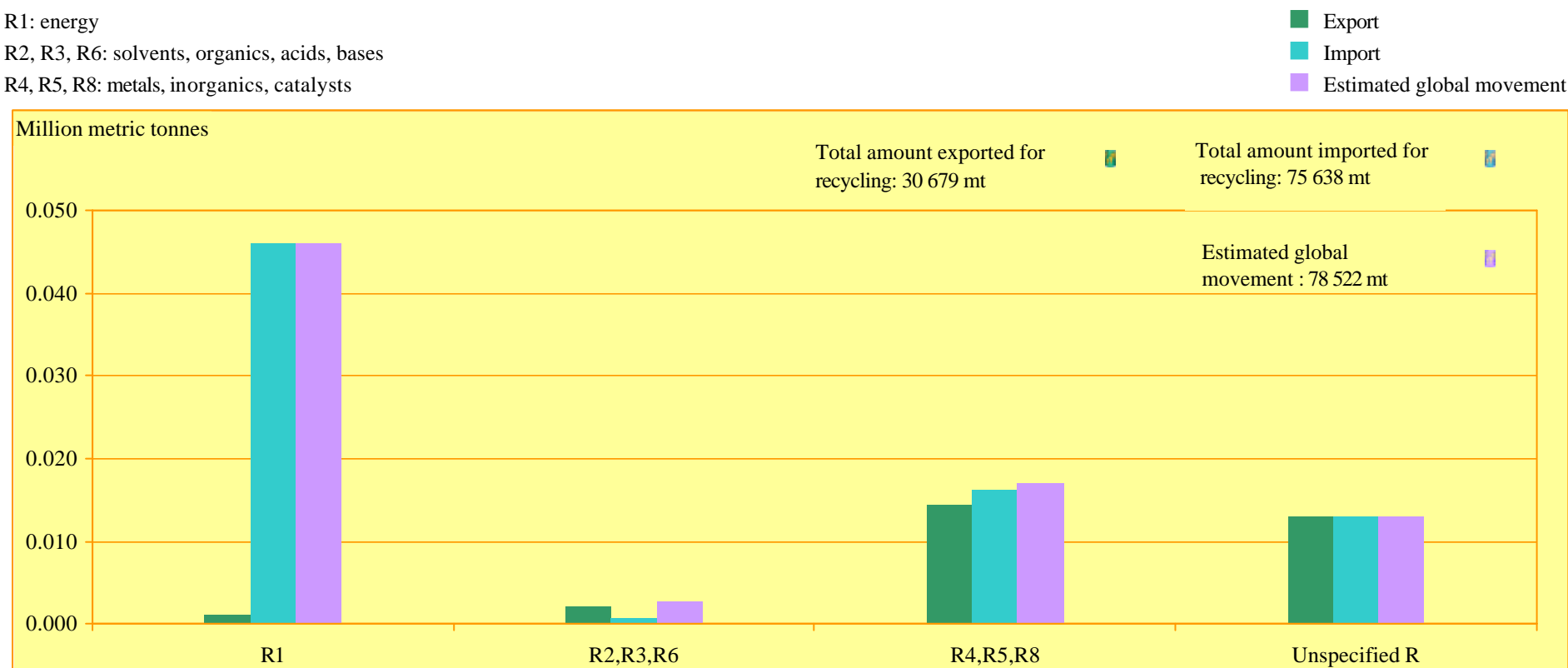

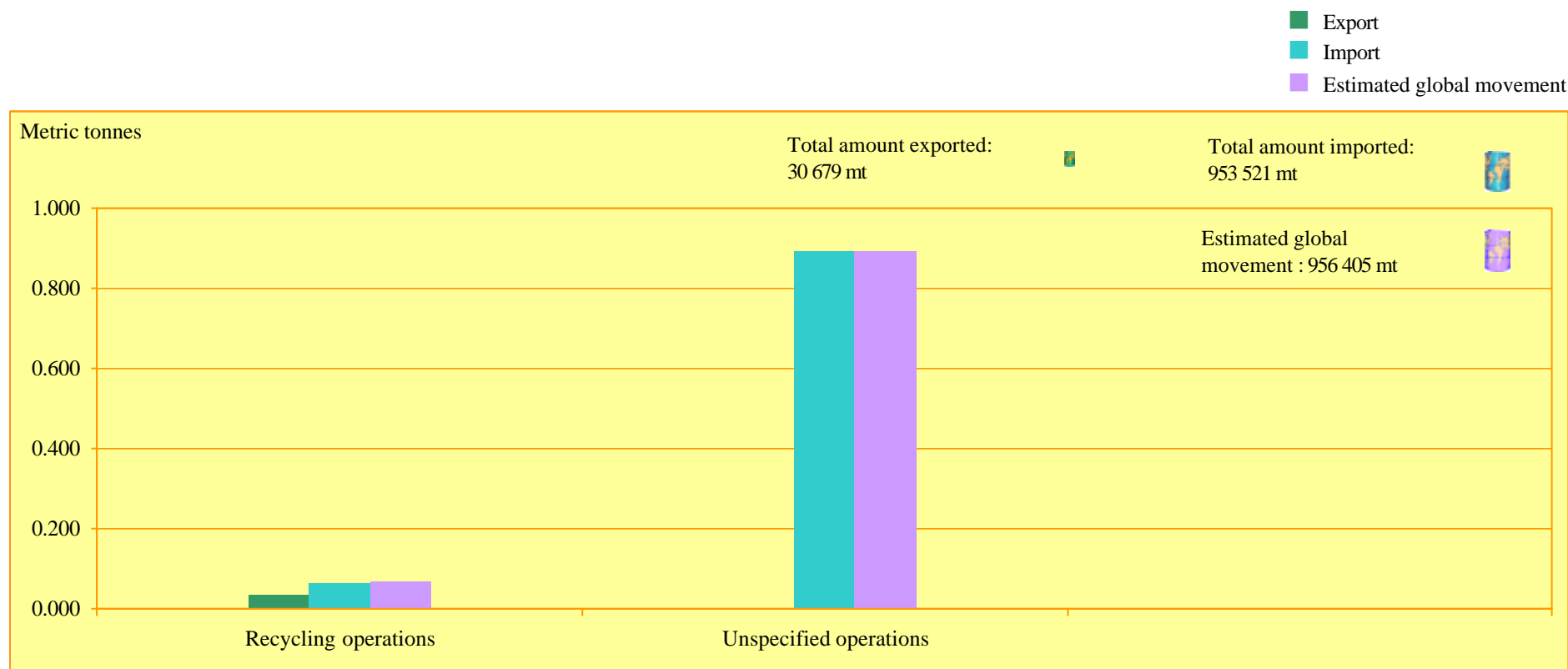
