
Figure 1: Generation of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes in 2002








Figure 3: Generation of Hazardous Wastes by Y19-Y45 categories in 2002





Figure 6: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes for *Recycling* among all reporting Parties in 2002




Figure 7: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes by Operation among all reporting Parties in 2002





Figure 8: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes among non-OECD reporting Parties in 2002


Figure 9: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes for *Recycling* among non-OECD reporting Parties in 2002






Figure 10: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes by Operation among non-OECD reporting Parties in 2002


Figure 11: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes among OECD reporting Parties in 2002


Figure 12: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes for *Disposal* among OECD reporting Parties in 2002

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Figure 14: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes by Operation among OECD reporting Parties in 2002






Figure 15: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes from non-OECD to OECD reporting Parties in 2002


Figure 16: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes for *Disposal* from non-OECD to OECD reporting Parties in 2002

Figure 18: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes by Operation from non-OECD to OECD reporting Parties in 2002





Figure 19: Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes from OECD to non-OECD reporting Parties in 2002


